

PRIVATE W. M. FRANKLIN.

Co. M, First Alabama, Died Friday Night at the Hillman Hospital.

Private W. M. Franklin, Company M, First Alabama, died at the Hillman hospital after a lingering illness caused by chronic dysentery. He had had a long spell in the division hospital at Jacksonville before he came to Birmingham about a week or two ago, and since his arrival here he has grown steadily worse. His death has been momentarily expected for the past few days. His is the fourteenth death in the First Alabama.

Franklin enlisted in Birmingham, and was always considered an obedient and efficient soldier. On the muster roll he gave his nearest relative as his wife, though it was not known at the hospital yesterday where she is now living. He is also said to have two children. Both of his parents are dead, but the deceased had relatives living in Trussville, and the remains will be expressed to his brother-in-law, H. H. Hadden, at that place this morning at 4:25 o'clock.

Franklin's loss is much regretted by the members of his company and by all the men in the regiment who knew him.

Private Sizemore, the sickest typhoid patient at the general hospital, was removed to the Hillman hospital yesterday. Privates Herzog and Hale were discharged.
