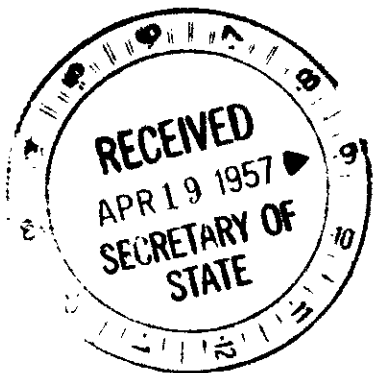


The United States of America,

To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

KNOW YE, That Abner Franklin, having deposited in the General Land Office, a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Cahaba, Alabama, whereby it appears that full payment has been made for 145.25 acres on the north side of Fractional Section 29, east of Alabama River, in T. 14 N., R. 9 E., St. Stephens Meridian, Alabama, to be cut off by a line running due east and west; of the lands directed to be sold at Cahaba, Alabama, in pursuance of the Laws providing for the sale of the lands of the UNITED STATES in MISSISSIPPI and ALABAMA, THERE IS GRANTED by the United States, unto the said Abner Franklin and to his heirs, the tract of Land above described; TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances, unto the said Abner Franklin, and to his heirs and assigns forever.

This patent is granted as and for a patent intended to have been granted and issued on October 29, 1827, but the issuance of which is not sufficiently evidenced by the records of the Bureau of Land Management.
