This day came the Plt^s by their Attorney and the Def^t in proper Person and the said Def^t Acknowledged the Plt^s Action Therefore it is Considered by the Court that the Plt^s recover against the said Def^t five pounds Eleven Shillings & Ten pence Court money the Debt in the Declaration mentioned & their Costs by them about their Suit in this behalf expended & the said Def^t in Money &c.

But this Judgment except as to the Cost is to be discharged by the payment of two pounds fifteen Shillings & Eleven pence half pence with Interest thereon at the rate of five per cent per Annum from the 22^d day of June 1724 to the time of payment

On the Petition of Edward Franklyn who is very old & almost blind it is Ordered that he be exempted from the payment of County Levy for the future

On the Petition of the Rev^d Mungo Marshall for a Road to be cleared from the Lycebe over Raylors Run into the Road that goes to Beverlys Mill the most convenient way for his going to the Upper Church it is Ordered that Peter Rucker William Golding Thomas Newman & Phil. Easton or any three of them being first sworn before some Justice for this County faithfully & impartially to view the same do go & view the said Intended Way & make report to the Court of the Convenience & inconvenience attending the same

Upon the Petition of John Gholson against Samuel Rice & Elizabeth his wife to be released on Aus^t of his Securityship for the said Elizabeth due Administration of the Estate of William Pollard dead it is Ordered that the said Rice be summoned to Appear at the Next Court to answer the same

William Cleveland as Constable took the Oaths to his Majesty's Person & Government & subscribed the Oath of Allegiance & also took all the Oaths required as Constable in the presence of William Sears.

John Henderson is appointed Constable in the room of Tho^s Graves & it is Ordered the Sheriff Summon him to the Next Court to be sworn into the said Office

On the Petition of Thomas Merry he is allowed to keep Ordinary at his house in this County for an Year from this time giving Security whereupon he with Geo. Smith his Security entered into & Acknowledged their Bond for his keeping the said Ordinary according to Law and it is Ordered that the Clerk of this Court prepare Licence for him accordingly
