X Elisha Anderson's Will for record November 3rd 1834

State of Alabama In the name of God I Elisha  
 Montgomery County Anderson being sick and weak  
 in body but of sound mind memory and understand-  
 ing and considering the certainty of death and the  
 uncertainty of the time of the time thereof and to the  
 end that I may be better prepared to leave the world  
 whenever it shall please God to call me hence do  
 therefore make and declare this my last will and  
 testament in the manner following to wit I leave  
 to my wife the land when I live or being one  
 hundred & fifty acres and I do also will that my  
 said wife shall pay my son Elyah one hundred  
 Dollars and that my wife shall one horse  
 bridle & saddle one bed and furniture one large  
 chest and one trunk and three cows three col-  
 ures and also that my wife shall have six  
 sitting chairs one table the crockery ware  
 and one Pot and two ovens and one some year  
 belong And I do also give leave the one  
 hundred Dollars that my wife shall to  
 my son Elyah one some more saddle

I bequeath and give unto my daughter James one Bed and furniture and to my daughter Lavinia one Bed and furniture and whenever the estate coming me in from my mother Lavinia Anderson in my will that that my two daughters James and Lavinia should so much more of said legacies as to make them shares equal with the rest of her children

And lastly as to all the rest residue remainder of my personal estate goods & chattels of what kind soever I will that William Parmer my sole executor shall sell and divide equally between my wife and children

In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 20th day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & thirty four
