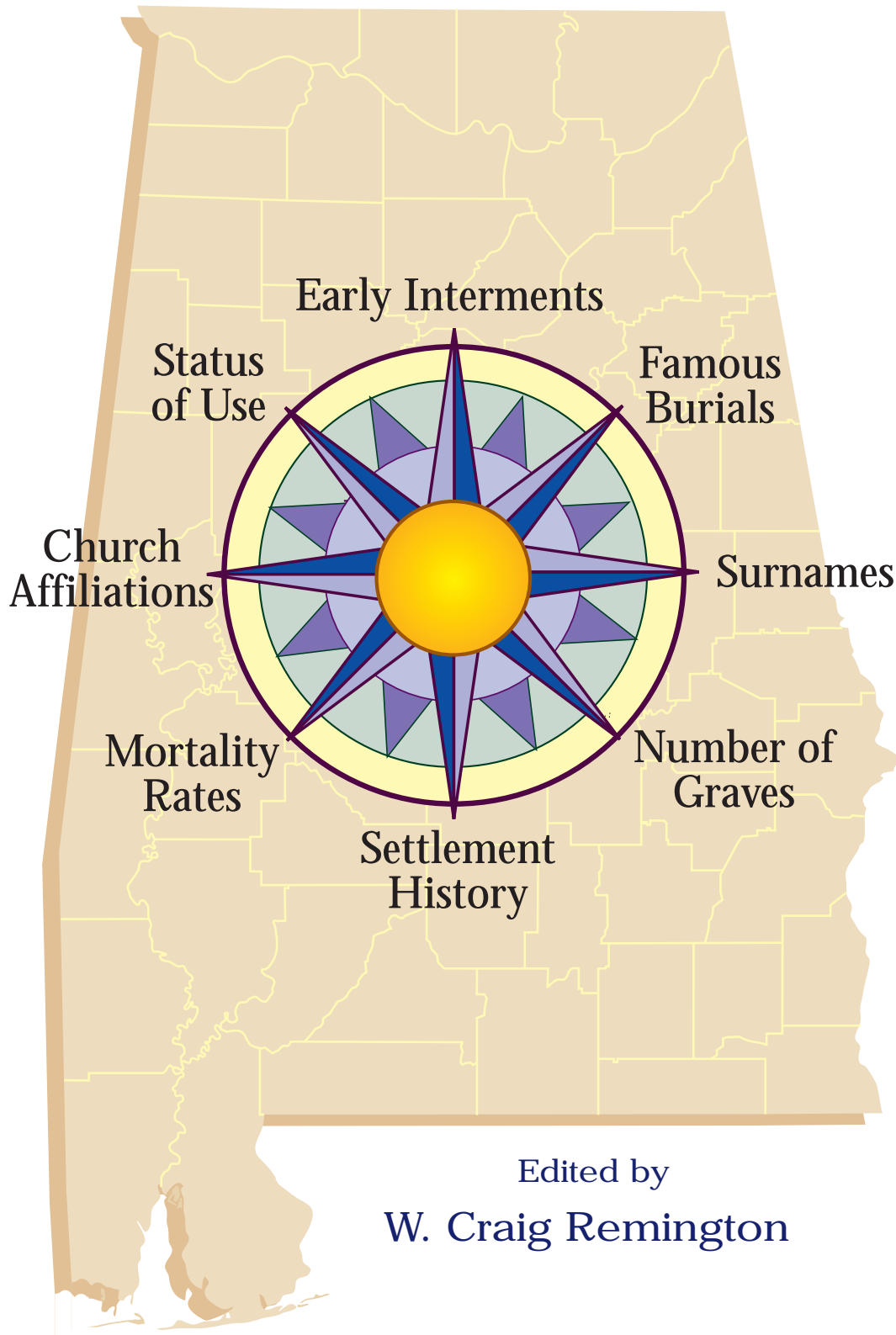

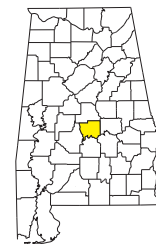

Autaugaville	134 - SW	T17N, R14E, Sec 23	Autaugaville United Methodist Church, organized in 1818; 27 graves; first known interment: Catharine <b>Golsan</b> (d. 1840); last known interment: Mary E. R. <b>Lucas</b> (1819-1901); <b>Golsan, McKay, McNeill, Scott</b> and <b>Thompson</b> are common to this cemetery (2) (16) (24)
Bethel	60 - NW	T19N, R12E, Sec 25	Bethel Baptist Church, established in 1847, approximately 70 graves; also called Spigner Cemetery; <b>Chandler, Colee, Longcrier, McCullough, McKinney, Moore, Ousley, Raspberry</b> and <b>Spigner</b> are common to this cemetery with interments dating from the 1960's (12) (16) (30) (34)
Bethel Grove	2 - NW	T19N, R12E, Sec 15	Bethel Grove Church; 14 graves; first known interment: James <b>McCorky</b> (d. 1882); last known interment: Faraby <b>Longcrier</b> (d. 1922) (6)
Bethesda	27 - NW	T18N, R14E, Sec 19	Bethesda Baptist Church, established in 1855; approximately 215 graves; first known interment: James Nicholas <b>Brackin, Jr.</b> (b. & d. 1929); <b>Cael, Caver, Deramus, Jackson, Jones, Langford, Walker, Wallace, Wainwright</b> and <b>Wyatt</b> are common to this cemetery still in use (16) (22) (34)
Bethesda	29 - SW	T18N, R14E, Sec 19	Bethesda Missionary Church; a black cemetery of approximately 1000 graves; first known interment: Julia Bell <b>Jones</b> (1900-1953); <b>Caver, Cutler, DeBardelaben, Howard, Motley, Parker, Tyus</b> and <b>White</b> are common to this active cemetery located adjacent to Jackson and Nunn cemeteries (16) (34)
Big Springs	8 - NW	T19N, R14E, Sec 18	Big Springs Baptist Church; approximately 350 graves; first known interment: Julia A. <b>Butler</b> (d. 1873); <b>Breadlescomb, Cherry, Gafford, Smith, Spigner, Turner, Wilson, Wright</b> and <b>Wyatt</b> are common to this active cemetery (16)
Big Springs	82 - SW	T16N, R12E, Sec 1	Big Springs Church; a black cemetery of approximately 30 graves; first known interment: Ezekiel <b>Steel</b> (1891-1949); <b>Jackson, Lee</b> and <b>Steele</b> are common to this cemetery still in use (16)
Billdee	108 - SE	T16N, R15E, Sec 14	a black cemetery of 15 graves; first known interment: Fanny L. <b>Douglas</b> (1910-1911); last known interment: Ethel <b>Wainwright</b> (1903-1972); <b>Smith</b> is common to this cemetery (16)

Billingsley	173 - NW	T20N, R14E, Sec 32	Billingsley Church of God; a new cemetery (10)
Billingsley Junction	130 - NW	T19N, R13E, Sec 14	located behind Gilligan Store; the grave of George R. <b>Thompson</b> (1875-1958) with 3 unmarked graves (1)
Bishop	65 - NW	T18N, R12E, Sec 13	7 graves; first known interment: Edmund <b>Bishop</b> (1806-1870); last known interment: Reuben Joshua <b>Bishop</b> (1847-1928) (16)

Chapman	114 - SE	T17N, R16E, Sec 16	a black cemetery of approximately 700 graves; first known interment: Celeste <b>Williams</b> (1927-1932); <b>Anderson, Averhart, Cain, Coleman, Davis, Douglas, Dozier, Gardner, Hall, Harris, Johnson, Jones, Lewis, Long, Robinson, Stoudemire, Washington,</b> and <b>Wyatt</b> are common to this active cemetery (16) (34)
Colee	57 - NW	T19N, R13E, Sec 18	approximately 60 marked and numerous unmarked graves; first known interment: Henry <b>McBride</b> (1802-1870); <b>Colee, Herrod, Langston, Spigner</b> and <b>Walker</b> are common to this cemetery still in use (1)
Confederate Veterans	90 - SW	T17N, R13E, Sec 12	also known as Hall, Jones or Zeigler Cemetery; approximately 40 graves; first known interment: Mary Eliza Zeigler <b>Jones</b> (d. 1840); last known interment: Mary Hall Bennet <b>Hain</b> (1903-1963); <b>Hall, Jones</b> and <b>Zeigler</b> are common to this cemetery (16) (29) (34)
Cooper	9 - NE	T20N, R15E, Sec 21	a black cemetery of approximately 25 graves; first known interment: W. M. <b>Cooper</b> (1865-1900); <b>Cooper</b> is the only surname found in this active cemetery (16)
Cory	91 - SW	T17N, R13E, Sec 1	
Cottrell	138 - SE	T17N, R14E, Sec 26	also known as Cottrell Landing Cemetery; 6 marked graves and one unmarked grave; first known interment: William W. <b>Cottrell</b> (1818-1823); last known interment: Larkin <b>Cottrell</b> (1819-1891) (16) (37)
County Line	48 - NE	T18N, R16E, Sec 15	County Line Church
County Line	49 - NE	T18N, R16E, Sec 14	County Line Church of Christ; approximately 40 graves; an active cemetery begun with the interment of Henry G. <b>Oswald</b> (1892-1969) (28)
County Line	52 - NE	T18N, R16E, Sec 24	County Line Church
Curtis	139 - SW	T17N, R13E, Sec 32	Curtis Family Cemetery; the graves of Elizabeth, May and Mira <b>Curtis</b> (16)
Davis	140 - SW	T17N, R14E, Sec 33	8 graves; first known interment: Elizabeth Dawson <b>Davis</b> (1831-1849); last known interment: Sophronia Wiggins <b>Davis</b> (1829-1915); Revolutionary War veteran Lewis Cookman <b>Davis</b> is found here (1) (6) (29)

DeJarnette	100 - SE	T17N, R15E, Sec 6	approximately 20 graves; first known interment: Robert <b>Caldwell</b> (1812-1821); last known interment: John Caldwell <b>Henderson</b> (1856-1862); <b>DeJarnette, McBrydes, Robinson</b> and <b>Wilkinson</b> are common to this cemetery (5)
Deramus	74 - NW	T19N, R14E, Sec 4	a black cemetery of approximately 75 graves; first known interment: Pearl <b>Deramus</b> (1900-1934); <b>Deramus</b> and <b>Smith</b> are common to this cemetery still in use (16)
Deramus	26 - SW	T18N, R14E, Sec 21	4 graves; first known interment: Mary J. <b>Hollowell</b> (b. & d. in 1866); last known interment: J. M. <b>Rawlinson</b> (1897-1903) (2) (6)
Deramus	142 - NW	T18N, R14E, Sec 18	5 graves (6)
Doster	116 - SE	T17N, R16E, Sec 22	also called Dosterville Cemetery; 16 graves; first known interment: John W. <b>Lynch</b> (1799-1833); last known interment: Zachary <b>Abney, II</b> (1877-1942); <b>Doster</b> and <b>Langford</b> are also found here (16) (34)
Durden	110 - SE	T17N, R16E, Sec 5	approximately 400 marked graves; first known interment: Hattie Ila <b>Durden</b> (1871-1872); <b>Barber, Bulger, Cargill, Coker, Dennis, Duncan, Durden</b> and <b>Thompson</b> are common to this cemetery still in use (16) (34)
Durdin	143 - SE	T17N, R16E, Sec 20	a black cemetery of approximately 225 graves; first known interment: Adelin <b>Ralfe</b> (1874-1920); <b>Albert, Smith, Thomas, Ward</b> and <b>Williams</b> are common to this cemetery still in use (6)
