

WILL OF TYRE M. HUGHS:

Will Book #4, pages 52, Butler Co., Ala. Courthouse:

State of Alabama

Butler County, November the 2nd. 1883.

Know all men to whom it may concern, That I, Tirey M. Hughs of said State and County, and a man of Sound mind do, do make this to be my Last will and Testament - first I will and bequeath unto my wife, Louisa N. Hughs, all my property, both real and personal goods and chattels, that I may be possessed with at my death, during her life time or widder-hood, provided whe gives all my miner children the chance to obtain an equal education with them that is now of age, and that she give to each of my boy children as they become of age, one average horse, bridle and saddle, and that she give each of my girl children a bed and her clothing when they marry and I further will that my wife and my executer shall have the rite to sell any of said property when they think it best for the good of the family or for the carying out of the provisions of this will and I further will that if my wife die before my youngest child becomes of age, that my executer see to the carying out of this will, now upon the death or marrage of my wife or when my youngest child becomes of age, then I want all my property to revert to my lawful aries and to be equally devided among them and the mode of devision to be this, my executer to chose three disinterested men, who shall devide said property in to as many lots as there may be heirs, and write each lot on a seperate peace of paper, each slip of paper being the same size, then place said slips in a box and let each are or their personal representative drqw one slip of paper from said box and the property included on said slip shall be thier share and I further appoint Lovett A. Hughs, as my Executor, to carry out the provisions of this will and I further request that he shall not be required to give any bond.
